How to become a member:

Step 1

Memberships are done by family. Your family becomes a member of PBJh and then you can register multiple people under your family membership. Between December 26th and January 4th you will complete the "[Become a Member](#)" form and pay a deposit of \$55 that will be applied towards your membership fee.

Step 2

You will sign up the people in your family for individual programs according to the schedule below. Complete a "Sign up for Programs" form for each person you want to register for 1 or more programs. January 5th-10th

January 7-8 – Members from the Fall 2025 term and/or Winter 25-26 term

January 9-10– New members

You should receive an invoice by 5 PM on January 16th. Payment is due between the time you receive your invoice and 7PM on January 23rd. Payment reserves your spot in class. PBJh has a no-refund policy.

The program is targeted at people in this age range. Only arrangements that go through PBJhomeschoolers@gmail.com will be honored.

Class Size

Classes that don't have enough enrollment to meet the minimum will be cancelled. If the class fills before you have a chance to register, you will have the opportunity to be put on a waitlist. While you are not guaranteed a spot by being on the waitlist, we do manage to put a surprising number of people on waitlists into their desired programs.

Cost

The cost is the price for one person (unless otherwise stated) to take the class for the duration of the class. If I sign a kid up for an eight-week program, the listed cost covers the entire 8 weeks.

Location

Our campuses include two churches and two private residences. Once registration and payment are complete, you will be sent addresses for each campus.

Attendance

- 1) Please do not attend if a person in your group is sick, has been throwing up, or has run a fever **in the last 24 hours**.
- 2) Programs are listed as Consistent attendance or Drop in. Consistent attendance means you are making a commitment to be there each session unless there is an emergency or an illness. Drop in means come if you want- no commitment!
- 3) Please be respectful of the attendance designations. If you sign up for a class that has Consistent attendance without the *intention* of attending regularly, you are:

- negatively affecting the experience of all the kids in the class,
- causing unnecessary work and frustration for the facilitators, and
- you are keeping other kid(s) from being able to fill that spot.

Parent Involvement

Drop off: you can stay with your child or you can drop them off and leave the premises. Please be aware that some programs, like Field Trips or Museum of the Southwest, require parents to register if they are planning to attend/participate and are not acting as an official chaperone.

On site: A parent or POD needs to be on-site for programs with this designation. On site could be in the classroom, in a common area, or even outside in your car. Teenagers who are allowed by the state to operate a motor vehicle can transport themselves to campus and are NOT required to have a POD with them for these programs.

Parents are responsible for the supervision and behavior of their children. Plan to have an adult family member on site the first two times your family attends programming that requires a parent On Site. Parents are welcome to join their children in class, to hang out in common areas, or to stay in their vehicles. After the first two attendances, you can opt to use a POD. A POD (Parent on Duty) is a friend who you are authorizing to take care of your kids, as though you were dropping them off at their house. YOU need to communicate with the POD AND your kids to make sure everyone is aware of who is responsible for the kids. This is so if there is a medical issue, an emergency, or a behavior problem, the Parent or POD is there to handle it.

Our facilitators are prepared for minor off task behavior. They are NOT expected to deal with children who are resistant, defiant, or otherwise significantly misbehaving. Please be sure your child(ren) are interested in the programs you are signing them up for or plan to attend with them to ensure they stay on task.





Fused glass classes, on the other hand, explore the melting and shaping of glass through heat, allowing for the creation of various forms and incorporating techniques like

slumping and creating unique glass surfaces. This is an introductory class, and will be a requirement for future classes.

Note: Closed-toed shoes required, we will provide goggles, gloves and mask. You will be around sharp glass and lead fumes. We have plenty of ventilation and masks for when physically using the solder iron. Arm/finger dexterity is helpful. Parking behind house in field. Brown shop in back.




